As we near the end of the month, we're delighted to share some updates and celebrate the achievements of our students. We are incredibly proud of our Year 13 Science team, who recently placed third out of 88 schools in a prestigious competition organised by Imperial College. Their hard work and dedication have truly paid off, congratulations to all involved and a special public thanks to Mrs Shillingford for supporting them.

Our Duke of Edinburgh's Award programme continues to thrive. Last year saw our highest completion rate ever, with excellent evidence uploaded by students. This year, 63 Year

9 students have signed up for Bronze, and many have already begun their journey. Seventeen Year 10 students are interested in Silver, and four Year 13 students are working towards Gold, with their final expedition planned for the Brecon Beacons next July. Two Year 13s from last year are close to completing Gold and will soon receive their award at one of the Royal Palaces. Well done to everyone taking part.

Ten Tors training is about to begin. We have three weekend day walks planned for November and our first full camping weekend in December. We hope to field five teams this year, and we are grateful to our dedicated volunteers who make this possible. #### Y11 Rugby Match Report—Wednesday 24th September

The first team pitch was inspected prior to kick off and the one end was felt to be too hard and so an adjusted pitch greeted the boys from the First XV as they welcomed St Peters to a sunny afternoon at Clyst Vale. The crowd was expectant of a close game and this proved to be the case in what will be remembered as 'the one that got away'.

Both teams have come a long way since their first meetings in Y7 and the size, speed and power from both sets of players was impressive to see. Dylan and Ollie running off breakdowns into huge collisions, George, James and Josh stopping and then sending backward St Peters runners in the tackle all drew gasps from those spectating. With a few absences this week it left Clyst Vale a little short of options, but Isaac in the pack equipped himself well as did Ellis, Max and Nat who all appeared willing and agile runners with the ball in hand.

It was Clyst Vale who broke the deadlock after a few St Peters infringements gave the CVCC lads field position. Jacob secured the ball at lineout and a platform was built from which Ethan having one of his best and most involved games drove over for the try on 10 minutes. George slotted the conversion to make it 7-0. However, some slick passing though the St Peters backs landed them with their first points on 20 minutes and with the conversion it was 7-7.

Into the second half and flanker Jacob took a knock that meant he was removed for precaution allowing Finn to roar into the action. We did not see his running ability, but his ferocity and commitment in the tackle was felt by a number of St Peters players. However, it was them that crashed over next to make it 7-14. Into the dwindling minutes another forward Ollie drove home for a try 10meters in from the touch line. The conversion was a tough one, but one George had practiced and felt confident in. However as it sailed toward the posts it faded slightly to the right and just missed the upright. 12-14.

The last few minutes were a fantic passage of back and forth. Michael and Oscar running and making yards in tandem and the remaining forwards securing ball for whoever was playing scrum half at the time. Sadly the final whistle came too early for a dramitic last gasp win for Clyst Vale and as the boys shook hands and cheered, most felt it was a game we could have won. However, both sides played well and for many in Clyst Vale shirts it was their best performance for some time.

#### Who was Harry Patch?





## Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

## **Reporting an Absence**

If your child is absent due to illness or a medical appointment, please report their absence, along with the reason, via the My Child at School **desktop browser**. Alternatively, you can complete the Absence Notification Form using the link below or email:

#### **Absence Notification Form**

If your child is in Year 12 or 13, please report their absence to voyseys@clystvale.org.

Absences must be reported daily for the duration of your child's absence.

If you know in advance that your child will be away from school, please inform us at your earliest convenience.

Additionally, kindly notify us of any lateness or scheduled appointments.

The school actively follows up on unexplained absences. If your child is absent for an unauthorised event, the details may be referred to the Educational Welfare Service which could result in a fixed penalty notice. Please be aware that the College may request supporting documentation for any absence.

Typically, work is not provided for students during their absence, as our priority is to ensure they recover fully and return to school as soon as possible.

#### Lateness

Attendance is formally recorded twice daily: in the morning at 8:50am and in the afternoon at 2:10pm. It is essential that students are prepared to begin their tutor period promptly at 8:50am and are punctual for each subsequent lesson.

As required by law, registers must be taken in a timely manner, and there are consequences for lateness. Students who arrive after registration closes will be marked as late, and those arriving after 9:25am will receive an unauthorised mark.

If a student is absent without prior notification, we will inform parents/carers as soon as possible if your child has not arrived at school in the morning. To ensure prompt communication, parents/carers are strongly encouraged to keep their contact details up-to-date via the Bromcom App.

Attendance is recorded during every lesson to monitor internal truancy and comply with safeguarding regulations. Students are required to sign in upon late arrival or sign out if leaving during school hours. Parents/carers must notify the school and provide a valid reason for their child's departure.

No student may leave College without authorisation from staff under any circumstances.

Students feeling unwell must report to reception and are not permitted to contact parents directly through phone calls, texts, or messaging apps to request collection.

## **Medical Appointments**

We encourage students to maximise their attendance, as research highlights a strong correlation between regular attendance and examination success.

Many medical appointments can often be scheduled in a way that allows students to attend school both before and after their appointments. By doing so, they can minimise missed learning opportunities while maintaining high attendance levels.

We kindly ask parents/carers to ensure that their child attends morning registration, even if a medical appointment is scheduled later in the morning. Similarly, where possible, afternoon appointments should be arranged after **Period 4**, during lunchtime. We also encourage students to return to school following lunchtime appointments, if feasible.




