Principal's Update







Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to all the parents and carers who attended the Post-16 consultation evening last night. This was a valuable opportunity for open dialogue regarding our decision to propose a phased closure of this provision and to address your questions. Please take the time to read the consultation document and share your views, as these will be considered before any final decision is made.

This week, we focused on curriculum enrichment, suspending normal timetabled lessons to deliver our Deep Learning Day. Year 12 and Year 7 students went on trips: Year 12 visited Plymouth University, while Year 7 explored the history of Exeter with visits to St. Nicholas Priory, the museum, Rougemont Castle, and the Cathedral. Year 8 immersed themselves in culture through various language-based activities, Year 9 explored healthy lifestyles, and Year 10 engaged in sessions on careers, work experience, and addiction education. The "5 Lives" group provided talks from individuals with firsthand experience of addiction and mental health issues. We were extremely impressed by the high levels of interest and respect our students showed for both the topic and the visitors.

Unfortunately, we have recently received reports of a small number of students behaving in an antisocial manner while traveling to and from school on public Stagecoach buses. If your child uses these buses, please support us by reinforcing the importance of appropriate behaviour at all times.

Next week, we will host our annual Year 6 Transition Days, designed to help new students familiarize themselves with the College, meet their tutor group, and get to know key staff members. I look forward to welcoming this new cohort and am confident that our current students will act as superb ambassadors, making these newcomers feel excited and welcome.

If you are a parent or carer of a Year 10 Drama student, please congratulate them on their performance in the practical component of their exam. They have worked incredibly hard and their dedication has made their teachers immensely proud.

Tonight, I look forward to seeing our Year 11 students at their annual prom. This event is always well attended by students, dedicated staff, and proud parents, who gather to watch the grand arrivals. The prom symbolizes the culmination of years of hard work and the transition into a new chapter, making it a truly special evening for all involved.

Clystvale arrived at the tournament with 2 teams consisting of 7 players each from Years 7 and 8. Both competing at the opportunity to win the Cup or the plate trophies. Clystvale one was drawn in a group with Westexe, St Lukes 2 and Shebbear 1. Clystvale two were drawn in a group with St Peters 1, Teign 1 and QE 2. Clystvale 1 had goals galore in their group games winning 6-0, 4-1 and 6-1. Topping their group and securing a place in the ¼ finals of the Cup competition. Clystvale 2 were steady in the group and managed to secure 3 points, winning 2-1 and loosing 2-0 and 3-2. Finishing with 3 points but with a better goal difference than the others team, they finished 2nd and qualified for the ¼ finals of the Cup competition.

Sophia.T steps up and makes 3-2. Sophie.W next...scores to make it 4-3. Down to Kodie to try and save one to send the Vale through. SAVE CLYSTVALE win the shootout and progress to the semi-finals.

The semi-final draw was as follows Clystvale 2 vs St Peters 1 a repeat of the group game. Clystvale 1 vs QE 1 who they drew 0-0 in a previous tournament. Unfortunately, Clystvale 2 were outdone by a dominant St Peters team who were 4-0 victors in the end. Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Reporting an Absence

Parents are expected to inform us of their child's absence before 9.00 a.m. on each day of absence providing the reason for absence. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness. If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy. In addition, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if your child is absent from College due to illness.

Lateness

The school day (first registration session) starts at 8.50 am, all students are expected to be in their classroom at this time.


Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. We ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment if they can.

Please give the school as much notice as possible, at least two weeks' notice is useful.

If the appointment requires the pupil to leave during the day, they must be signed out by an adult listed on the student's record at the main reception.
